## Structure

### Lower division studies

120 CP (ECTS)

- › Systematic structure of the lower division studies over 4 semesters
- › All 18 courses are compulsory and assessed with credit points
- › All courses are completed with an examination
- › All forms of examination are fixed

### Upper division studies

120 CP (ECTS)

#### Compulsory courses

- › 9 courses/9 examinations (incl. Bachelor thesis and internship semester abroad, each amounting to 30 CP).
- › Form of examination and CP are fixed
- › Semester abroad with recognition of approx. 24 CP and accompanying courses work "Organizing a Study Abroad Semester".
- › Total scope in the compulsory area: up to 100 CP depending on the scope of the recognition from courses taken abroad.

#### Electives

- › In the elective area, 2 courses must be completed with an examination
- › All further courses serve to acquire the required CP
